

GRADUATION PROGRAM

To graduate, students will require 80 credits level (including English 12 and CLC)

Other required courses:

- Two Career Education courses (8 credits): CLE and CLC
- Physical Health & Education 10 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 (4 credits)
- A Language Arts 10, 11 & 12 (12 credits)
- An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)
- An Indigenous focused graduation course (either a Language Arts 10 or 12, or a Socials 12)

GRADUATION PROGRAM

In addition, students will also be required to complete three Provincial Graduation Assessments in literacy and in numeracy.





- See your grade 9 math teacher for guidance/advice. Be honest and realistic
- Discuss your teacher's recommendation with your parents
- The general guideline is that you should have earned a C+ or higher to study in the "Foundations and Pre-Calc" pathway
- A second math pathway is Workplace 10
- Remember that for colleges, many programs have math upgrading available for you if necessary, or math upgrading is already built into the program


