GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The B.C. Certificate of Graduation, or Dogwood Diploma, is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements. To graduate, students require at least 80 credits total.

Of these 80 credits:

- Credits are required from the following requirements:
 - O Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
 - O Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - o Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - o A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 course (4 credits)
 - o A Language Arts 10, 11, and a required 12 course (4 credits required at each grade, 12 credits total)
 - o An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits total)
 - o Career Life Education (4 credits)
 - A course that meets the Indigenous-Focused graduation requirement (4 credits) (E.g. English First Peoples 10, Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12, English First Peoples 12)
- At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 course and Career Life Connections
- In addition, students are also required to complete three Provincial Graduation Assessments; Literacy 10, Numeracy 10 and Literacy 12.
