





Indigenous Graduation Requirements

All students graduating must complete at least one 4-credit course in Indigenous Studies:

- English First Peoples Literacy & Writing 10
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12
- First Peoples English 12



GRADUATION PROGRAM

To graduate, students will require 80 credits total, with a minimum of 16 at the grade 12 level (including an English 12 and CLC)



Other required courses:

- Two Career Education courses (8 credits): CLE and CLC
- Physical Health & Education 10 (4 credits)
- Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 (4 credits)
- Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 (4 credits)
- A Language Arts 10, 11 & 12 (12 credits)
- An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits)
- An Indigenous focused graduation course (either a Language Arts 10 or 12, or a Socials 12)

GRADUATION PROGRAM

In addition, students will also be required to complete three Provincial Graduation Assessments in literacy and in numeracy

Rams Football and Cross Training

A year-long PE/Cross Training course has been added for all 2026-2027 Football team members. Grade 12 players can choose one semester or two semesters of this course. If you elect to take one semester, select Cross Training 12 only (semester 1). For two semesters, select Cross Training 12 and Active Living 12.

CHOICES TO CONSIDER...



- Basic grad = 80 credits with CLC 12, a Language Arts 12 plus a minimum of two grade 12 courses
- College Career Programs – may need specific requirements in Math and English (check with the institution to be sure)
- University Transfer – English 12 with over 67%, Math 11 (check with the institution)
- University Entrance –
 - English 12 + three to five academic grade 12 courses (confirm with the institution)
 - Note: some universities are looking for six to eight courses in the Grade 12 year that are specific to your area of intended study

If students wish to apply DIRECTLY to university out of high school, they need 4-6 academic courses for their application. The number of courses and the specific courses depend on the university and the faculty they are applying to. Students that are looking to go to college after high school do not need to have academic courses, they just need to meet graduation requirements and earn a minimum of 67% in English 12. Planning for Post-Secondary

Please do your own research as requirements can vary from university to university, but general requirements are listed below.

Humanities: English 12

Business: English 12, Pre-calculus 12, (Calculus 12)

General Sciences: English 12, Pre-calculus 12, 2 Science 12's (often Chem 12 & A&P 12), (Calculus 12)

Engineering/Physics: English 12, Pre-calculus 12, Physics 12, Chemistry 12, (Calculus 12)

Computer Science: English 12, Pre-calculus 12, (Calculus 12), and a Science 12

** most Universities require a total of 4-6 academic 12's for entrance including the courses listed above. They will use your grade 11 marks as a placeholder until grade 12 marks are finalized.


Math Selection Process

Math is an elective in Grade 12



- See your grade 11 math teacher for guidance/advice; be honest and realistic
- Discuss your teacher's recommendation with your parents/guardians
- The general guideline is that you should have earned a C+ or higher in Pre-Calc 11 to carry on in the Pre-Calculus pathway
- An additional math pathway is Foundations 12 (offered if enough interest)
- Remember that many post-secondary institutions have math upgrading available
- Be sure to check post-secondary admission requirements

Honours Math



- Select math honours - if you are interested in being considered for the course
- Acceptance into math honours will be determined by the math department based on the application process and teacher recommendation
- Just because you are in math honours this year, does NOT guarantee you'll be in math honours next year
- A math honours class will run only if there is enough interest

At Mount Douglas, language courses are offered in French, Italian, Spanish and Travel Languages. Language 12 courses (French, Italian and Spanish) count as an academic 12 for university entrance. A language 9-11 is required for students applying to American Universities.

Elective choices

Some electives, you chose based on your grade level. If you are grade 12 age, you take Woodwork 12, regardless of your skill level. This applies for all PE courses, all tech ed courses, guitar, art, media design, drama, dance, film & tv, food and textiles.

Other electives have prerequisites. AI & Game Design 11 must be taken before AI & Game Design 12. Similarly for photography, accounting, languages, computer, math and science courses.


